Home and School memberships will be available for purchase at the front entrance of the school. We accept cash and no longer take cheques.



Our first Home and School public meeting will be announced in the near future. In the event that there are any open positions on the **Parent School Support Committee**, **the PSSC elections** will be held in conjunction with Meet the Teacher night on September 21st. Please consider this worthwhile venue to get involved in your child's school. The committee discusses and makes recommendations on broad educational issues relating to school performance, goals for improvement, family and community involvement, and creating an inviting school climate. 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Allergies- We continue to have students and staff with nut and latex allergies as well as some classroom specific situations. Your child's teacher will communicate those to you. We appreciate your cooperation by sending only peanut-free foods to school with your child and by respecting the individual situations as informed. In addition, we request that you and your family refrain from wearing scented products for the comfort and health of our scent-sensitive children and staff.

Dogs- After more than one incident last school year, we are asking that no dogs enter the school property during pick up or drop off times. This is very hard for school staff to enforce while their primary focus is on the safety and wellbeing of our students. Please do not bring your pooch to school as we have several students who feel uncomfortable around our four-legged friends.

Visitors/volunteers- Please remember to stop by the office to pick up a visitor or a volunteer badge if you enter the building for any reason during the school day. We are committed to maintaining a focused learning environment during class time therefore we request that interruptions to learning time be kept at an absolute minimum. If your child has forgotten a lunch, jacket, etc. please contact the office and drop it off in the bin outside the main doors, we will ensure that s/he receives it.

Communication- Our school website along with email and Talk Mail are our primary means of communication with parents. School Profile sheets will be sent home next week to update student information. We encourage you all to visit our website at www.flb.nbed.nb.ca to stay current with news, events, advisories, and relevant documents. If you require a paper copy of our school correspondence, please send a note to your child's teacher.

Drop off and pick up- Students should only be dropped off at the Kiss and Drop loop off Pine Glen Rd between 7:50 and 8:10a.m. Staff members are available to assist children as needed. Please remain in your vehicle. Children should only exit on the right side and on to the sidewalk. This ensures everyone's safety and prevents a back-up of traffic waiting to pull into the lane.

There is no passing in the Kiss and Drop loops. Please remind your child to proceed directly to the playground. If you need to park when dropping off or picking up your child please use the side streets or the Masonic Hall parking lot and cross the street with the crossing guard on Cleveland Ave. The St. Paul's Church parking lot is not available for drop-off or school parking; please respect this restriction. We want to remain good neighbours.

Home time pick up -When meeting your child at 1:30 dismissal, we ask you to wait at a distance from the school (close to the Play Park is good) until the bell rings. Our grade 3-5 students find that the view through the windows is very distracting at the end of the K-2 day
